BANJA LA UKHONDO



WASHTED, a Research Centre at Polytechnic
University of Malawi implemented a 2 years research
study focusing on Food Hygiene and Water
Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH) that aimed at reducing
diarrhoea in under-five Children of Chikwawa
District; T/A Masache, T/A Maseya/A Ngowe and part
of T/A Ngabu. 1000 under five children were recruited
in the study.

WHICH HYGIENE BEHAVIOURS?

Hygiene behaviours were identified which may be leading to childhood diarrhoea. We used household surveys, microbiology sampling, observations and interviews over 9 month, and identified:

- Lack of handwashing with soap at critical times
- Poor food hygiene practices
- Poor water management practices
- Poor disposal of animal and child feaces

So these areas became the target of the Banja la Ukhondo project










HAND WASHING WITH SOAP





















BEFORE FOOD PREPARATION

- To prevent diarrhoea in under-five children and the whole family make sure you always:
- Wash your hands with soap after latrine use, cleaning child's bottom, before food preparation and before child feeding/eating
- Wash your child's hands before they start eating
- Clean utensils with soap and always keep utensils on elevated place
